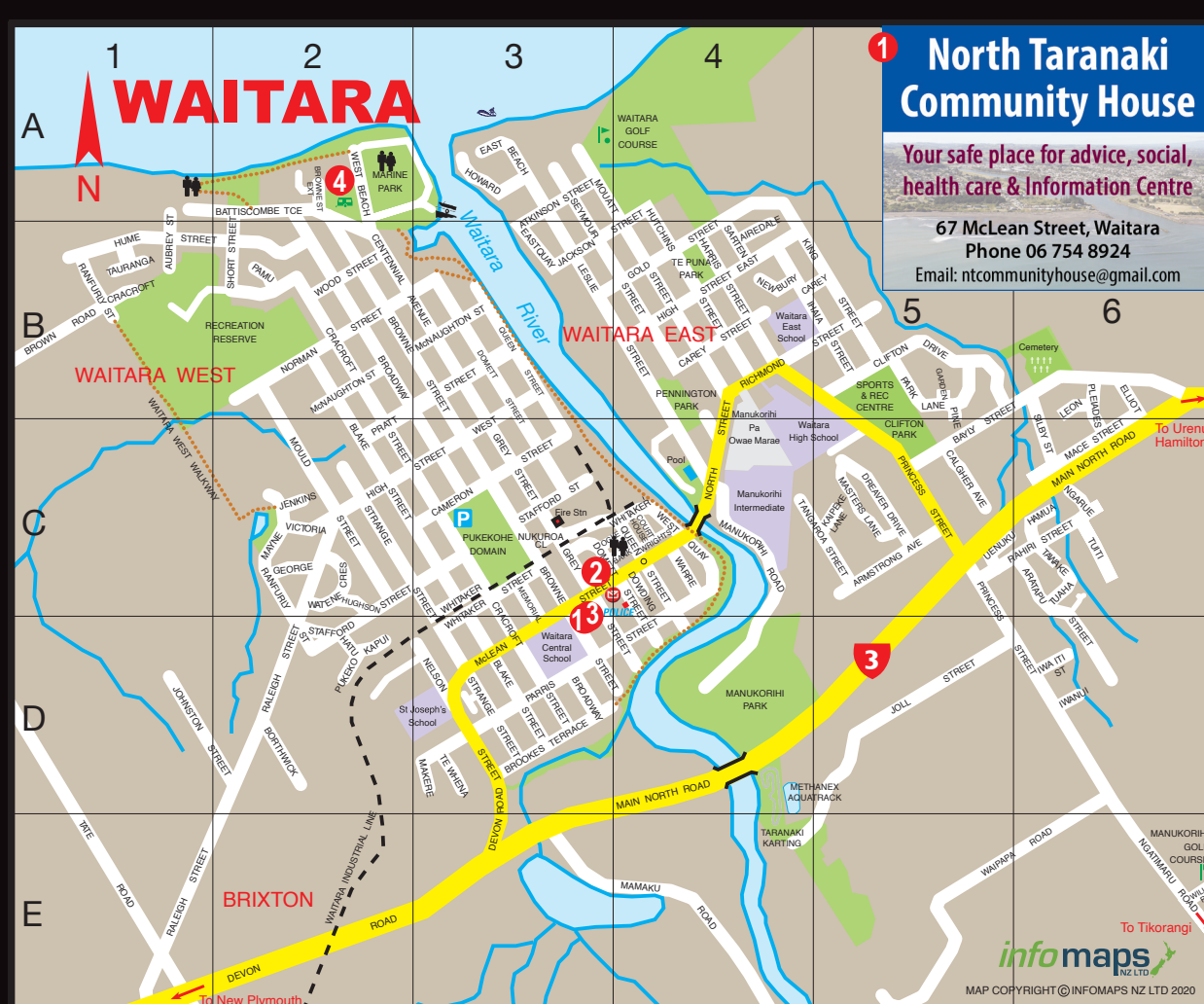

Whether you want to escape the rat race for a holiday, attend one of the region's exciting festivals, go fishing, tramping, skiing, or anything in between, South Taranaki offers it all. Its stunning natural environment, rugged coastline and grown up urban attitude mean that once here, everything is on your doorstep - you can be on the mountain in the morning, the beach in the afternoon and dining out in any one of our top class cafes or restaurants in the evening. Wedged between Mt Taranaki's majestic cone and the Tasman Sea, South Taranaki boasts sufficient outdoor pursuits to satisfy even the most thrill-seeking visitor. From climbing to the top of Hawera's historic water tower, ascending Mt Taranaki's famous peak, surfing on some of the best breaks New Zealand has to offer, to simply breathing the spirit that is Paritahi, South Taranaki offers an experience like no other. Stratford - the heart of Taranaki and gateway to the National Parks - is situated at the junction of State Highway 3 and State Highway 43, "The Forgotten World Highway".

Travel along SH 43, following New Zealand's first Heritage Trail for 150 kilometres, and enjoy untouched scenery including the Tangaraku Gorge at the edge of the Whangamomona National Park. As the closest main centre to Taranaki Mounga, Stratford is the main access to the Manganui Ski Area and Dawson Falls, the starting point to many popular hikes in the National Park.

While in the Stratford township view New Zealand's only glockenspiel which performs a scene from Romeo and Juliet four times daily. Explore the local art galleries and visit Percy's Place for a unique piece of Taranaki art. Visit the public parks and gardens and take the opportunity to walk the various walkways accessible from the town centre. For a more physical walk try the Cardiff Walkway - a three kilometre circular walk along the banks of the Waingongoro River. From the lookout on a clear day you can see Taranaki Mounga and all three mountains of the central plateau to the east. To the south of the town lies the Taranaki Pioneer Village with 40 furnished buildings including authentic cottages dating back to the 1850s. These early pioneering buildings house amazing collections of memorabilia.

Inglewood, often referred to as the crossroads of Taranaki, is ideally located only fifteen minutes from New Plymouth, the Mountain, the airport, Waitara, the sea and Stratford - a great place to visit and stay a while. With a population of around 3000 the town is known for its friendly people and great service with some innovative and unique businesses, many exporting manufacturers and specialised retailers. Local tourist attractions include the world famous 'Fun Ho! National Toy Museum' and 'Sidco' sporting trials museum. Art and culture feature strongly with Antiques and Art Galleries, the library, cafes and the modern yet intimate 'Cue Theatre' which has many excellent local and national performances. There are 28 Historic Buildings included on the local heritage trail and some beautiful gardens and farm attractions in and around Inglewood and the Rhododendron in the centre of town is reputed to be the largest in the Southern Hemisphere. A driving trail, the 'Old Coach Trail' which traces the coach route from Inglewood to State Highway 43, joining 'The Forgotten World Highway' with points of interest shown on a map in the brochure which can be picked up from the **Inglewood Information Centre**.

There is certainly a lot to keep people active with walkways, playgrounds, the public pools and sports grounds - the most significant being the TET Stadium with the best all weather athletic track in New Zealand and anyone wanting to stay in or around the town can choose from a number of accommodation places. You needn't travel far out of Inglewood to find even more excitement and entertainment. Travel towards New Plymouth to find North Egmont Visitors Centre and Kamihia Café on Mount Taranaki. Travel East towards Stoney Oaks wildlife park, pottery and bush and tree reserves. Head South for the Gliding Club and North for even more cafes and gardens.
